INTERNATIONAL PEACE CONFERENCE

31st May 2024

Participants of the Peace Conference will have the opportunity to discuss and present their ideas about the solutions for today's security situation in which the world teeters on the brink of a major conflict, with no guarantees for peace.

Following the discussion, conclusions will be drawn and proposals for actions that could bring stability in the future will be documented.

The result of the conference will be a Call for Peace Initiative that will be introduced on the International Peace Public Gathering on the Venceslav's square in Prague the next day - June 1st, the World Children's Day.

Call for Peace will be delivered to all relevant global institutions, as well as the governments of the permanent members of the Security Council of UN and governments all other countries with request for support. Above all, this Call for Peace will reach a wide global audience. Citizens of different countries will have the opportunity to participate directly in shaping their own future by signing the Call for Peace Initiative on pre-prepared web platforms in many countries.

The Call for Peace is an initiative that will trigger a wave that will resonate in the hearts of ordinary people who refuse to passively watch as the military machinery consumes entire generations of innocent people.

12:00 p.m. - Press Conference

1:00 p.m. - Opening Remarks by **JUDr. JÁN ČARNOGURSKÝ**, Deputy Prime Minister of the Federal Government of Czechoslovakia (1990), Prime Minister of the Slovak Republic (1991-1992), and Minister of Justice of Slovakia (1998-2002).

1:15 p.m. - Speeches by Speakers (10-15 minutes each). Each speaker is requested to offer an original perspective on the causes of current global security instability and propose solutions for ensuring future global security.

5:45 p.m. - Conclusion of the conference. Announcement of the International Peace Initiative and publication of the Call for Peace Negotiations.

Requests for Conference Speakers:

Given the scientific-political nature of the conference, all speakers are urged to submit their speeches in written form in advance. These speeches will then be processed, edited, and made available online and in printed form.

Speakers are encouraged to facilitate the work of translators by providing their speeches in advance. The languages of the conference are English, Czech, and Slovak. All speeches will be available in English, with translations into Czech or Slovak. Additionally, translations into Russian will also be provided.

Speakers are requested to provide contact details for journalists in their respective countries to whom press releases should be distributed before and after the conference.
